Key achievements to date:	Areas for further improvement and baseline evidence of need:
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Nazeing Primary School achieved the Gold Award from the School Games in June 2022 for the 4th consecutive year. This continues to be a reflection on the many years of progress and developments made within school sport. • This year, Nazeing attended 17 school games competitions. Overall, participation numbers at competitions has increased. In addition to the A team, on many occasions we had B and C teams taking part. • Events included opportunities designed for children of all abilities - Change 4 Life, SEND festivals, Mini Olympics and Level 2 and 3 events. • The year 5/6 hockey, netball and football teams all made it through to the Harlow District finals. • The year 5/6 tag rugby team made it to the Tri Cluster County finals. • Both the girls and boys cricket teams came second in the district finals. • Year 6 Sports Crew was selected and organised structured physical activity during lunchtimes in KS1 and KS2.
