Reading

It is hugely important that you read to your child and listen to them read at least 3 times per week. Reading regularly can improve your child's confidence, develop their emotions and empathy, improve analytical and critical thinking skills as well as improving their focus and concentration.

Regularly reading with your child will also hugely improve their vocabularies.

As a school, we ask that you hear your children read at least 3 times per week. Please spend a couple of minutes briefly discussing the story and the characters asking them about why things happened: this will be extremely beneficial.

Please make sure you sign your child's reading record when you have read with them.


Phonics Screening Check

<u>Homework</u>

We will be continuing weekly number bonds or times tables test every Monday from Monday 15th January. Year 1 children will be learning number bonds of 5, 10, 20 and 100, progressing to work counting in 2s 5s and 10s. Year 2 will be learning 2, 3, 5, and 10 times tables. Please encourage children to practise their mental recall of these number facts regularly at home.

In the back of their reading records, the children have logins for NumBots (Year 1) and TT Rockstars (Year 2) and Edshed (spellings for Y1 and Y2). They can log on to these to practise regularly at home.

Year 2 will also have weekly homework on MyMaths <u>https://www.mymaths.co.uk/</u>.This will be set on a Tuesday for completion the following week. Details for logging into this are in the back of your child's reading record.
